The Struggle for Safe, Affordable Housing in Forsyth County

Finding and keeping safe, affordable housing has become one of the greatest challenges facing families in Forsyth County today. Rising rents, limited housing stock, and higher utility costs are creating a crisis for many of our neighbors, especially those who are already living paycheck to paycheck with few resources to fall back on.

At Crisis Control Ministry, we see firsthand the difficult choices families face when their budgets simply don't stretch far enough. Too often, a medical bill, a missed day of work, or an unexpected car repair pushes a family into a financial crisis. When rent or utilities go unpaid, eviction and disconnection notices quickly follow.

For 52 years, CCM has walked alongside individuals and families during these short-term financial crises, helping them stabilize and remain in their homes. Our founders believed, and we still believe today, that a community is stronger when everyone has a safe, affordable place to live. But what do we do when affordable housing is scarce?

That's the challenge we face now. Even with rental assistance, the lack of affordable housing in Forsyth County means many families struggle to find a place they can call home. This shortage forces us to think beyond temporary relief. At CCM, we continue to provide immediate help with rent and utilities to prevent homelessness, but we are also advocating and partnering with others in our community to push for long-term solutions.


Together, we must ensure Forsyth County is a place where safe housing is not a privilege but a foundation for every family's stability and well-being.


