Celebrating 35 Years of Hope du Jour

In 1991, both the World Wide Web and Hope du Jour made public debuts. Like the Internet, Hope du Jour has sustained and grown in popularity over the years. Over its 35 years, Hope du Jour has endured Y2K, the Great Recession and even COVID-19. It has continued to be an inspiration for bringing the community together.

As Crisis Control Ministry's annual signature event, Hope du Jour truly embodies the spirit of Crisis Control. This win-win event brings the community together to support local food and beverage establishments and help neighbors who are experiencing a financial crisis while at the same time giving friends, families and neighbors an excuse to gather.

Taking place on the first Tuesday in May, participating establishments contribute 10% of their proceeds to Crisis Control Ministry. This year's event is scheduled for May 6, and we are pleased to see an expanding network of dedicated partners—from longstanding favorites to innovative new establishments. Your Support Impacts Lives

Love knows no language barriers.

Late one afternoon, just 30 minutes before closing, Abeni, a young mother, arrived at Crisis Control Ministry with her onemonth-old baby. A friend had dropped her off, hoping she could find the assistance she desperately needed.

Abeni speaks only Wolof and knows no English. But language was no obstacle to the love and compassion of our staff. Using a translation service through our recently updated phone system, we conducted an interview and quickly qualified her for assistance. Recognizing the urgency of her situation, the interviewer notified the pantry staff. Though it was nearly closing time, the pantry manager stayed late to help Abeni shop in our client-choice pantry to ensure she received two weeks' worth of healthy groceries to sustain her through
